



Rigging the 4" Flasher



The Pro-Troll 4 inch flasher is designed to catch trout, kokanee and walleye. Its diagonal kicker fin provides an erratic spinning action and the electronic EChip on the flasher provides nerve pulse attraction to the fish. To be effective, the flasher needs to spin. There are two ways to rig the flasher to get the best spin.

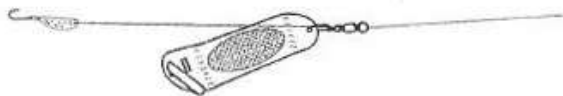
Method A - Standard Rigging

For trolling speeds of 1.5 MPH and up, the flasher is best rigged in line with a bait or lure trailed 10 to 20 inches behind the flasher. This system works very well when trolling small spinners, flies, bugs or hoochies.



Method B - Slow Speed Rigging

For trolling speeds below 1.5 MPH, the flasher will work better if the line to the lure is snapped into the front swivel instead of the rear. This allows the flasher to more freely rotate and will enhance its movement and fish attraction. This method also works better with heavier lures that have more drag. The Pro-Troll size 1.0 and 2.0 kokanee and trout killers work best with this rigging.



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
